Primary Duties and Responsibilities

The School of Education is in need of two instructors to co-teach a 4 credit course in the Urban Education Fellows Program, an alternative teacher licensure program preparing teachers for middle childhood/early adolescent learners in elementary settings. The class assists the Fellows to apply content knowledge of the arts in designing effective teaching and assessment strategies across the curriculum. A key focus is on deepening their understanding of the relationships among the arts as well as between the arts and other disciplines by developing and implementing integrative learning experiences based on appropriate conceptual frameworks, applying current technology in meaningful ways, considering various populations and cultures and their values, collaborating with arts specialists, articulating connections to daily life, and designing appropriate assessments.

Class meets on 8 alternate Saturdays from 8:00-12:00 p.m. beginning January 16, 2010. In addition, the instructors will develop field trips for students on two non-class Saturdays.

Qualifications

Minimum 3 years teaching experience in K-12 settings and Wisconsin licensure in art (1 position) and music (1 position). Prior teacher education experience a plus. The successful candidate should have a commitment to teaching excellence and a willingness to work in a highly collaborative environment.

Master's degree is required; National Board Certification is preferred.
